NOT ALL SWELLING IS ALLERGY

HEREDITARY ANGIOEDEMA, or HAE, is a rare and potentially life-threatening genetic condition that involves recurrent attacks of severe swelling (angioedema) which can affect the face, hands, feet, throat or abdomen.

SYMPTOMS

Swelling of the face and/ or lips

Swelling of the hands or feet

Severe abdominal pain

Throat swelling

LABORATORY DIAGNOSIS

- Screening test: C4
- C1-INH Level & Function

TREATMENT

- Drugs approved for treating HAE attacks (where available).
- Fresh Frozen Plasma (when no approved HAE treatments are available).

Allergy medications
(antihistamines, corticosteroids,

in treating angioedema
due to HAE.
